Subject: Monthly Activity Report – May, 2007

Operations:

Emergency Incident Responses:

On May 18 at 01:44 PM, Pebble Beach and CAL FIRE units responded to a reported vegetation fire on Signal Hill Road. Upon arrival crews saw fire and smoke burning up the slope towards a house. The fire was contained to about a half an acre and was then extinguished. The cause of the fire is undetermined. There were no injuries or damage as a result of this fire.

On May 19 at 04:12 PM, Pebble Beach Fire station and paramedic personnel responded to a gunshot injury on the ocean front at 17 Mile Drive and Ocean Road. An elderly male was found at the scene with a gunshot wound to the head. The wound appeared to be self-inflicted. Monterey County Sheriff's Department, California Highway Patrol, Carmel Regional Fire Ambulance, and Pebble Beach Security responded to the call as well. The patient was transported via Stanford Life Flight to Santa Clara Medical Center but did not survive.

On May 26 at 08:46 AM, fire crews responded to a reported refuse fire on Fire Road # 3. Upon arrival crews found a bonfire that was burning at the cross of Fire Road # 3 and Fire Road # 7. The fire is being investigated.

On May 29 at 01:25 PM, crews responded to a reported refuse fire on Wildcat Canyon Road. Upon arrival crews found a rag in the center of the road that had been on fire but was already extinguished. On May 29 at 01:50 PM, fire crews responded to a reported refuse fire on Oleada Road. Upon arrival it was discovered that someone had ignited a book and left it to burn in the middle of the road. CAL FIRE investigators have determined that these two incidents were related. The responsible persons are three non-resident students who attend a private high school in Salinas. This was an "end of year prank", and the investigator is working with the parents. It's not known yet if any criminal charges will be made. The investigator is confident this incident is not related to our wildland fires.

On May 17, at 02:09 AM, fire crews were dispatched to a medical aid on 17 Mile Drive. An incorrect address was relayed to the responding crews. As a result the PRV and the engine had to investigate to find the call location. The PRV was closest to the incident location and had a 5 minute response which is within the Standard Response Time.

The engine had to find a place to turn around and travel back to the correct address. This caused the engine to have an 11 minute response time.

On June 14, at 09:46 AM, Battalion Chief Scoggin discovered an injured pelican near the Cypress Point Lookout parking lot. Monterey County SPCA, Pebble Beach Security and Engine 6611 were requested to respond to the site. Pebble Beach Security evacuated tourists from the parking lot while firefighters assisted the Humane Society Officer in securing the pelican. After the incident Chief Scoggin received a phone call from the SPCA thanking the Fire Department for the assistance and specifically the care and professionalism shown by Fire Apparatus Engineer Ryan Fischer.

Apparatus and Equipment:

All district equipment is in service.

Training:

Emergency Medical System Continuing Education Drills:

Personnel were scheduled to review Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) curriculum, practiced skills and complete written tests to obtain Continuing Education Units (CEU's). EMT's are required to complete 24 hours of CEU's every two years to keep their EMT certification current.

Engine and Truck Company Performance Standards

All companies were scheduled to perform in-service training on company performance standards in their respective response areas. This training is for companies to maintain proficiency in engine and truck company performance standards and to increase their knowledge of target hazards located in the district.

Wildland Firefighting Preparedness Training

All companies were scheduled to attend wildland firefighting preparedness training. The training was conducted by Training Captain John Owens and Carmel Hill personnel. The class was held at the Carmel Hill Forest Fire Station and was attended by Fire Companies from Monterey City, Pacific Grove and Carmel Valley Fire Departments. The training consisted of a review of the 10 standard fire orders, 18 situations that shout watch out, LCES, wildland fire urban interface firefighting and other wildland firefighting safety issues. Hands-on training was conducted on fire shelter deployments, firefighting hand tool use, safety and fire line construction, mobile pumping and wildland progressive hose lays.

County Movement Drill

Engine 7212 from Carmel Hill participated in the annual Mass casualty drill at the Monterey Airport. The drill was conducted by Monterey Airport District Fire Department personnel.

River and Flood Water Rescue / Rescue Boat Operations

Fire Captain Macdonald (Carmel Highlands) conducted a training class in river and flood rescue and rescue boat operations which was attended by Pebble Beach firefighters. This course is an approved California State Fire Marshals course.

Fire Prevention:

General Information

Pebble Beach Staff attended an agricultural hazardous materials program in Salinas on May 24th.

Staff attended the Monterey County Fire Prevention officers meeting in Salinas on May 8th.

Staff attended a "code crossover" class highlighting changes in the new International Building and Fire codes. This class was held in the City of Merced on May 22nd. The District staff is working with other local Fire Departments and Districts and the County of Monterey in the review and adoption of our local Fire Code proposal. This will be addressed in the coming year.

Fire Defense

Fire Crews from Gabilan Camp returned to Pescadero Canyon in May. They have now connected Sunridge Road to Fire Road 23. There is still work to be completed on Fire Road 23 between Fire Road 21 and Sunridge Pines. We have submitted a crew request to get this last part of the project completed.

Notices were sent to residents that Residential Fire Inspections will begin in June. Engine companies have received their assignments and have started these door to door inspections. More than 1300 homes are scheduled to be inspected this year. Staff is currently reviewing options to secure additional part time staffing to assist in completing more inspections on an annual basis.

Staff has met with a landscape designer who is in the process of drawing a conceptual plan for the Fire Safe Demonstration Garden. Terra Bella from Carmel Valley has experience with designing another local fire demonstration area as well as experience in residential fire defense landscaping.

Public Education and Training

Staff conducted fire extinguisher training at the Lodge on May 14th. A total of 52 people were trained in live fire usage, and safety procedures.

Staff and Station personnel conducted an evening fire drill at the request of Robert Louis Stevenson School for all school staff and students on May 14th. Drill meet time was 7:30 p.m., and alarm activation at 7:45 p.m. Drill and roll calls performed satisfactorily.

Staff conducted a series of training sessions for the Pebble Beach Company. These training sessions covered the scope of fire inspections as they are enforced by their Safety Committee. A total of 79 managers attended this training.

Staff conducted two live fire extinguisher classes at Monterey Peninsula Country Club on May 23rd. A total of 77 staff members were trained.

Staff assisted with a live fire extinguisher training exercise at the Del Monte Golf course on May 11th. Even though this is in the Cypress Fire District, it is a Pebble Beach Company facility. A total of thirty-seven staff was trained.

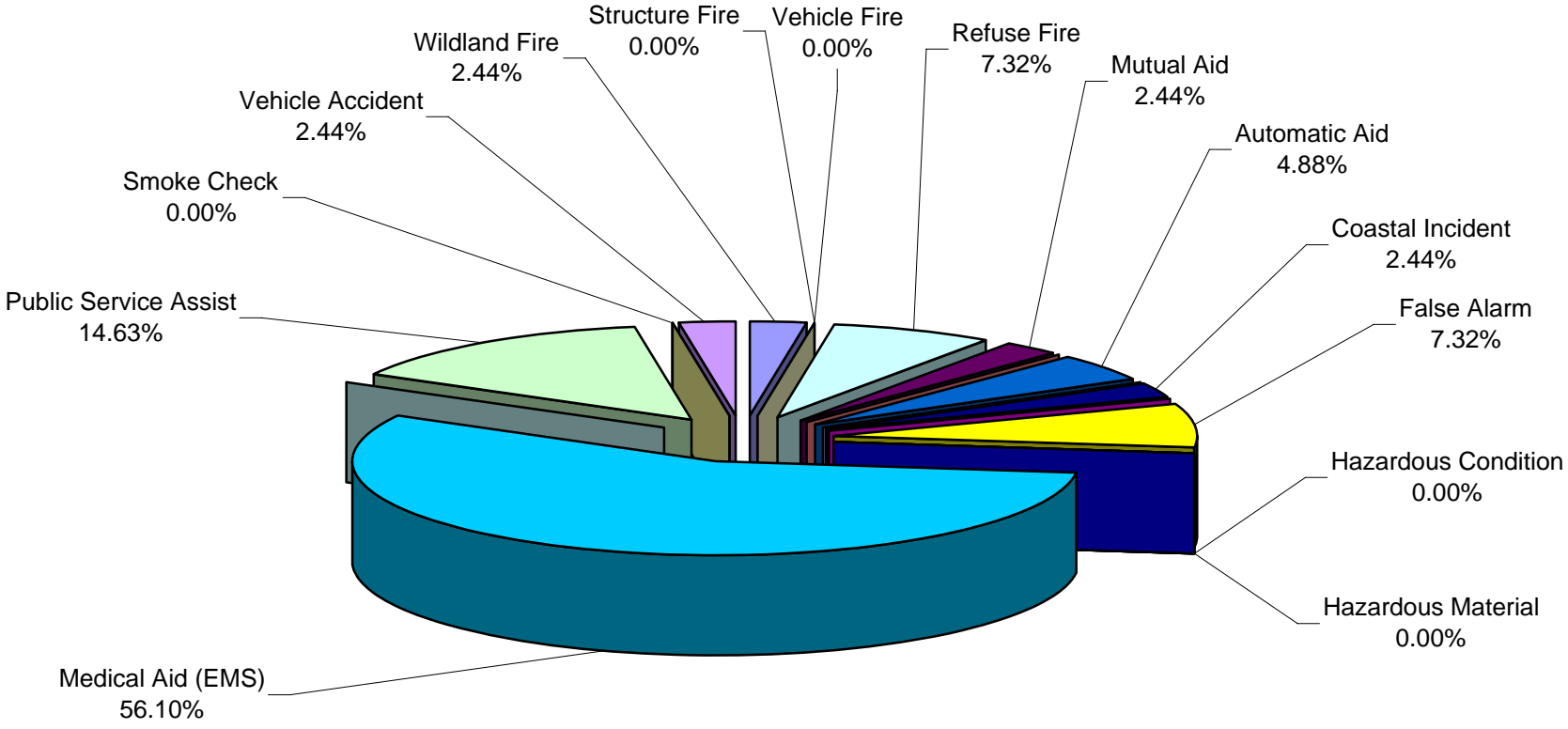

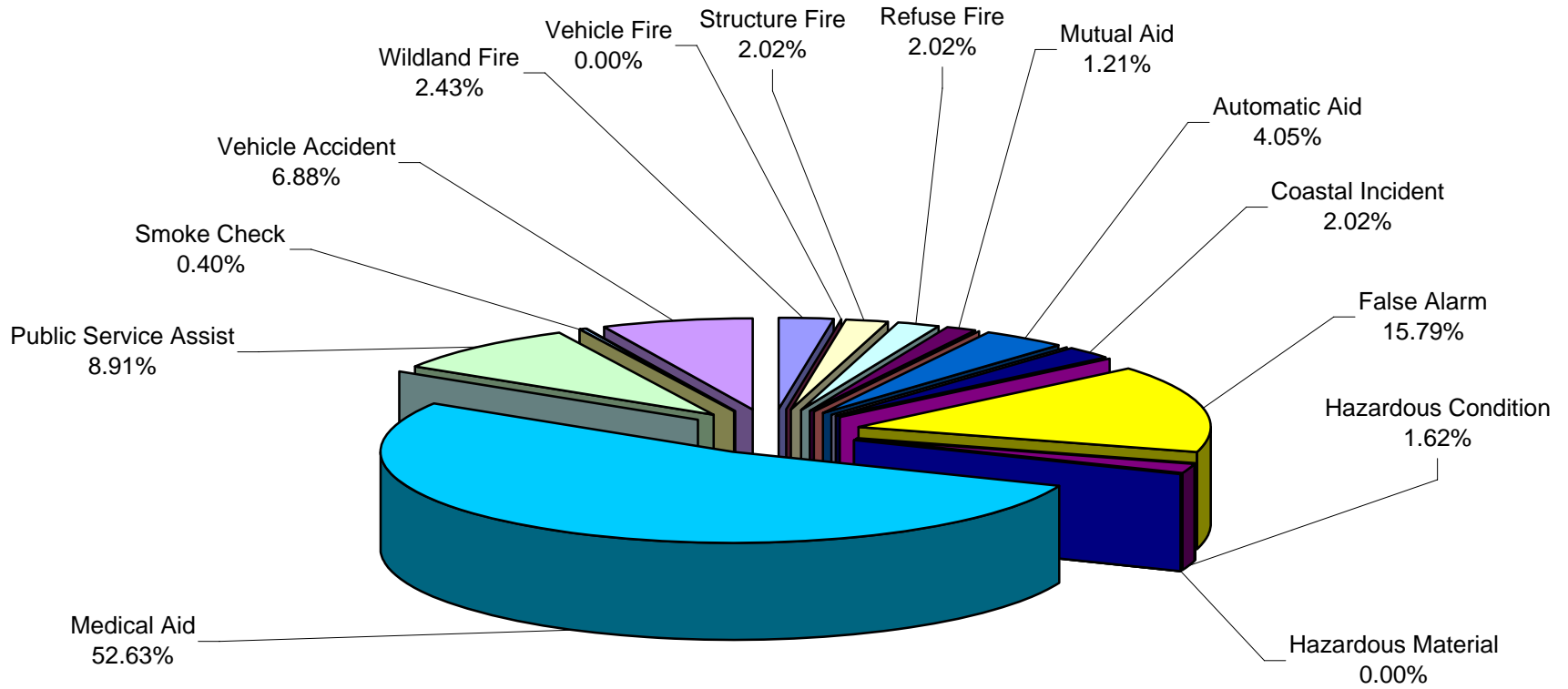
